211. THE CHAIRMANS OPENING REMARKS AND APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE

Apologies were received from Cllr Ken Shaw (holiday) and Cllr Michael Northey (holiday). It was noted that Cllr Paul Coakley was not present again, clerk to check how many meetings he has missed.

212. DECLARATIONS OF CLLRS INTERESTS AND REQUESTS FOR DISPENSATION

There were no declarations of interest or requests for dispensations relevant to this meeting.

213. MINUTES OF THE MEETING HELD 9 MARCH 2016

It was proposed by Cllr Wilson and seconded by Cllr Giles to accept the Minutes. The minutes were duly signed.

214. ADJOURNMENT OF THE MEETING

There was a question raised by resident Mr Irish. Mr Irish asked the Chairman to speak to Cllr Evans regarding comments previously made over a restraining order (which is not in place) and the banning of Mr Irish from the LPC Nature Reserve (which is in place). Cllr Evans had misunderstood the details of a conversation with the Community Warden, regarding restraining orders and had since retracted what was said. With regard to entering the Nature Reserve, the Committee had decided they did not want Mr Irish to enter the Cherry Orchard Nature Reserve, following several altercations, and had advised him so (as per a letter from the Nature Reserve Committee dated 13/01/16).

Mr Irish was then taken ill and an ambulance called. The meeting was paused for a period of time.

A written response to the question will be produced.

Cllr Stuart Walker arrived at 7.30pm.

215. COUNTY COUNCILLORS REPORT

The Clerk read out a report from Cllr Northey;

There is not a lot to report, but I am glad to note the signs are now fully in place for the Nargate Street restrictions. I am also thinking about how I can help over the moving of the village gateway at the Canterbury end, and will be discussing the matter with Ryan on my return – but can't make any promises as money is so incredibly tight.

216. CITY COUNCILLORS REPORT

Cllr Walker asked how we were finding the new arrangement of him forwarding details from CCC when he received them rather than waiting until our meetings. These are going direct to the Clerk who then forwards to the Cllrs the most relevant ones. This seems to be working well.

CLERK REPORT

LONDON PLANE TREE IN CARPARK

Stump grinding works now completed and the works to make good the paving surface should start in the next week or so.

REPAIR WORKS TO POST & RAIL FENCE IN CARPARK

A quotation has now been received for this works, to carry out the repairs with replacement posts by the crossing. Also to refit the rails into the fence on the corner of Jubilee road. Further quotation to be sought.

CHERRY ORCHARD WATER PIPE

It has now been established that First Port (the land management company that looks after estate at Cherry Orchard) is the bill holder for the additional meter in Court Hill that connects to the outside tap and fountain in the Cherry orchard estate. LPC has thus asked First Port to advise us exactly where they need to dig to repair this water pipe and also provide us with the details of their contractor who would carry out the works so we can put them in contact with our environmental consultant, to put the necessary environmental safeguards in place. As this site is governed by legal environmental conditions. We now await this information before we progress further.

220. WMH

Cllr Reid reported that the Cheeky Chicken Truck was no longer trading. Brown Owl, Stephanie Farrow is retiring from guiding after 30 years.

221. HIGHWAYS

Cllr Reid reported that the group have been pushing to; Move the village gateway further out towards Canterbury, create a buffer zone and move 30mph signage out further. Annual Speedwatch day is 21st April and a group of volunteers will be out in Littlebourne that day.

222. HOUSING

CCC have been pushing to allocate a non-eligible tenant into the current vacant property in Court Meadows. This is a one bedroom bungalow with level access shower facility. The legal agreement LPC have with Sanctuary sets out the criteria for eligibility for these properties. To be eligible for this bungalow the applicant must meet the Littlebourne Local connection criteria, unfortunately this applicant does not. LPC have applicants that do meet these criteria awaiting properties. LPC have requested a meeting with Sanctuary and CCC to discuss this matter further.

223. COMMUNITY FUND

Cllr Giles reported that the LPC Community fund have been able to make two payments this month; £574 towards the Queen's Birthday celebrations and £3135.25 towards the inclusive roundabout project (this was the outstanding amount needed following other funding from Vogt and Cardy's). Thanks was given to Viv Spratt for sourcing the remaining amounts for this project.

224. QUEENS 90th BIRTHDAY CELEBRATIONS

Set for Sunday 12th June 2016 on Littlebourne Recreation Ground, entertainments arranged so far include;

- Birds of prey demonstration
- Roving magician
- Bungee run and bouncy castle
- Activities to involve the school

225. THE LIST DEVELOPMENT

Cllrs were updated with the latest options for a community facility at the WHM and were shown a possible scheme to pursue further with Rydons. The focus groups are progressing as much as possible at this stage and will be ready for action once further details/plans are made available.

226. WMH CARPARK

The clerk had obtained prices for a grit bin to store away the grit more tidily. It was agreed we should order a 400litre one and place it over by the zebra crossing, in the carpark against the fence. Clerk to order. The grit will then need to be relocated from the exiting tonne bag.

Cllr Reid also had a suggestion for fixing wooden battening in front of the kerb in the parking bays, this might prevent vehicles getting too close to the fence.

The meeting closed at 9.15pm.
