2024-25 Finances

This coming year residents will see a small increase on their council tax bill for the parish element. This 2.76% increase is well below inflation and follows a number of years without increase, it equates to approx. £1.82 per year extra on a band D property in Littlebourne.

The parish council have been fortunate to be awarded two Capital grants from Canterbury City Council for the coming year; one towards the replacement of the bollards outside the shop/hall and the other towards the cost of the replacement doors and windows on the lounge side of the hall. Hopefully both of these projects will progress early in the spring.

Planning

We are being told by Canterbury City Council to expect the new Draft Local Plan at the beginning of March, there will then be a twelve-week period of consultation on its contents. We will then see which sites are still included and what the new transportation plans are for the district.

There has been no decision made on The Hill site as Gladman continue to add further documentation to their application in an attempt to satisfy the planners. As soon as LPC have any information to share on this application we will do so.



Have Your Say

20mph limit for main side roads in Littlebourne





LPC have been working with KCC Highways and as part of our HIP (Highway Improvement Plan) we had requested a 20mph scheme for the main side roads and the stretch of High Street between Jubilee Road and Nargate Street. Unfortunately, the High Street stretch cannot be included due to current speeds not being low enough and the length of road is less than the 600m required for a limit change.

Speed surveys have been carried out and the average speeds would support a 20mph limit being implemented on the side roads as shown in the plan adjacent. However, this can only happen if support is demonstrated by the residents of the village. So please share your views. The costs associated with this scheme would be in the region of £6000-£7000, Highways would contribute to some of the cost but LPC would need to fund the remainder (we already have funding set aside for this project).
