This year's plans for plot prizes:

As last year, an independent judge will visit the site and help us award plot prizes.

In addition we want to reward members who take on new projects that benefit the environment and wildlife. There will be prizes for adults and for children, if they run their own project. Here are some examples of positive actions that some members are already using:



Biological control: nematodes for slugs, ladybird or lacewing larvae for aphids; small ponds for frogs and toads; water for bees and birds to drink;



hiding and breeding places for slow worms and grass snakes; flowers that produce pollen for bees; feed plants for less common caterpillars and moths, such as brimstone or chalk blue butterflies;



small bug hotels, or solitary bee hives; cover crops for winter; 'no-dig' for soil health; only using peat free compost.

Of course, we understand the primary use of your plot is for growing crops, and there are limitations on what you can do in a small space.
