

As many of the village did, Littlebourne parish council has sent a detailed response to the public consultation on the draft 2045 Canterbury local plan focussing on many issues we see in such a large addition to the village and are now preparing to respond to the expected outline application. The main problems would be the large scale, the loss of farmland and landscape, the impact on village infrastructure especially on sewage and drainage and their effects on the Little Stour chalk stream, and A257 traffic burden.



Despite inflationary pressures, your parish council has voted to keep the overall village precept (the parish part of a householders' council tax) the same this year which, because of a large number of village houses now included in the calculations, means that the amount charged to each household for the Littlebourne component of their tax will be slightly lower this coming year.

Please do consider standing in the upcoming elections to be a parish councillor. Your village needs at least one further councillor to look after our local interests and keep Littlebourne the wonderful place that it is.

Voter ID



On Thursday 4 May this year there will be elections for all 39 city councillors and in some areas of the district, elections to parish councils.

The government has decided to introduce voter identification for these elections.

If you want to vote at the polling station in these elections, as well as being registered to vote, you will also need to show an approved form of photo ID before you can be issued with a ballot paper.

Without an approved photo ID, you will not be able to vote at the polling station. ID can be any of the following:

- Passport
- driving licence •
- Blue Badge •
- older persons bus pass, •
- Freedom bus pass •

Your ID doesn't have to be in date but it must look like you and be in the same name you registered to vote. If you don't have any photo ID you can apply for a Voter Authority Certificate, which you must do by 5pm on

25th April. This can be done online or with a paper form in the post. https://www.gov.uk/apply-for-photo-idvoter-authority-certificate
